Our populations of concern

include older adults, children and adults of any age with disabilities, and vulnerable adults at risk for abuse, neglect and exploitation.

Serving all 92 Indiana counties, we offer an established solution to manage risk, enhance health outcomes and control health care costs. Statewide, our network employs more than 1,800 people, with each AAA averaging 40 years of experience or more in service to their local communities.

AAA core services include specialized information and referral, options counseling, case management

and nutrition. Through a comprehensive, person-centered and needs-based approach, staff work with a diverse group of individuals and their support systems to identify needs, develop plans to address those needs, coordinate services and make referrals, resulting in long-term solutions that benefit consumers and the state. Depending on the assistance required, in-home services can save more than \$46,000 annually per person over the cost of nursing facility care.
